



INCIDENCE RATES FOR LUNG CANCER OVER THE PAST 20 YEARS



DEATHS FROM LUNG CANCER EACH YEAR – MORE THAN TWICE AS MANY AS ANY OTHER CANCER⁵


MORTALITY RATES FOR LUNG CANCER OVER THE LAST 20 YEARS





EUROPEAN RANKINGS

ONLY 8.7% OF LUNG CANCER PATIENTS LIVE BEYOND FIVE YEARS AFTER BEING DIAGNOSED – THE THIRD LOWEST IN EUROPE⁶



LUNG CANCER PATIENTS IN THE GREATER GLASGOW AND CLYDE NHS BOARD ARE MUCH MORE LIKELY TO DIE FROM THEIR LUNG CANCER COMPARED TO ORKNEY NHS BOARD⁷
